<p>How many Georgians would newly get health insurance through Medicaid?</p>	<p>Only 31,000-100,000 Georgians</p>	<p>More than 400,000 Georgians</p>
<p>Who is left behind and is likely to stay uninsured, even after the program is up & running?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Stay-at-home parents• Caregivers for aging family members or children with a disability• People in mental health or addiction recovery programs• Rural residents and communities of color where good jobs are much harder to find or may not exist at all• People who do not have good internet at home or do not own a car	<p>Almost no one!</p> <div data-bbox="805 788 1058 887"><p>That's 4 times less than Pathways.</p></div>
<p>What does the program cost?</p>	<p>\$2,490 per person</p> <p>Georgia has to pay for 30% of costs.</p> <p>Georgia does not receive any extra money for Pathways.</p>	<p>\$496 per person</p> <p>Georgia only has to pay for 10% of costs.</p> <p>Georgia would earn a "sign-on bonus" by choosing Medicaid expansion. The bonus would cover the costs of Medicaid expansion for 2 years with some money left over to meet the needs of families in our state.</p>

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
